### Highlights From The Past Few Months

- Debate over Pension Funding
- Governor refuses to fund education with funds set aside for the Geographic Cost of Education Index
- Governor vetoes a \$2 million project for MD Hall for the Creative Arts
- Governor rolls back toll increases
- Governor cancels Red Line and scales back funding for the Purple Line - reallocates funds to additional State road and bridge projects



### Highlights From The Past Few Months

- Governor closes Baltimore City Detention Center
- State closes FY 2015 with a fund balance of \$295 million
- State revenue estimates for FY 2016 and FY 2017 increase by more than \$212 million
- Governor cuts or eliminates fees totaling \$51 million over 5 years

### Looking Ahead to the Session

#### Local Transportation Funding

- Governor is committed to restoring local HUR and will likely begin the first year of a phase-in this session
- Local Transportation funding restoration will again be a MACo legislative priority
- Political landscape will make this challenging
- Will need all hands on deck!

#### • Fiscal 2017 Budget

- Larger than expected fund balance and increased revenues usually makes for an easier budget year, but not this year
- Competing priorities of Administration and General Assembly will make it difficult



### Looking Ahead to the Session

- Tax reform efforts will likely put pressure on county budgets
  - Administration interested in reducing tax burden on businesses and citizens
  - Presiding Officers appointed Augustine Commission to examine business tax structure and make recommendations liking becoming the General Assembly tax reform plan
  - While approaches may be different, proposals will affect local revenues
